AFTER-SCHOOL

- The Malone Center After-School Program served **97** children and youth and provided **29,200** hours of care and education.
- **89%** of program participants reported that the program helped them improve academically.
- **100%** of parents reported that Malone Center After-School Program helped their child academically.

(Outcomes are based on surveys results from 71 participants and 38 parents)

COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER

- The Culler Community Learning Center which provides before and after-school programs administered by Malone Center served **129** students 30 or more days.

Of the 129:

- **92%** improved their ability to get along with others/social skill development
- **83%** improved their academic performance from fall to spring
- **92%** improved their classroom behavior

(Outcomes are based on teacher surveys)

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

- Malone Center hosted **16** one-time events including public forums, education/awareness programs, focus groups, seminars, etc. with over **1,245** individuals attending one or more of the events.
- Malone Center had **325** volunteers that provided **4,307** hours of tutoring, cleaning, landscaping, and other service. ■

TALENTED TENTH SCHOLAR'S PROGRAM

- The Malone Center Talented Tenth Program served **23** unduplicated African American males.
- **70%** of participants reported earning better grades after attending the program.
- **80%** of participants had no new law violations during their participation in the program.

(Outcomes are based on participant surveys and juvenile justice reports)

JUNETEENTH

- The 2009 Juneteenth Celebration had over **2,500** people in attendance on Saturday, June 13. This year's event was held at Pentzer Park and featured a health and human service fair, barbecue, and live entertainment. ■

Advocacy Programs



COLLABORATIONS

- Malone Center collaborated with the Center for People in Need and the Food Bank of Lincoln to provide food for **6,465** people during weekly food distribution.
- Malone Center served **3,935** breakfasts and lunches to children and youth through collaboration with the Lincoln/Lancaster County Health Department Summer Food Program.
- Malone Center collaborated with the Lincoln Area Agency on Aging to facilitate the JoAnn Maxey ActivAge Center which served **150** elders. The JoAnn Maxey Senior Center provided social activities, educational programs, and a healthy lunch for elders Wednesday and Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
- El Centro de las Americas who is co-located with Malone Center provided English and Literacy classes, domestic violence support groups, and other advocacy services to **8,000** individuals.
- Malone Center provided meeting space for **6** different organizations to have regular weekly or monthly meetings. Organizations that met at the Center included Abiding Grace Community Church, National Council of Negro Women, and the NAACP. Approximately **300** people attended one or more of these meetings every month. ■

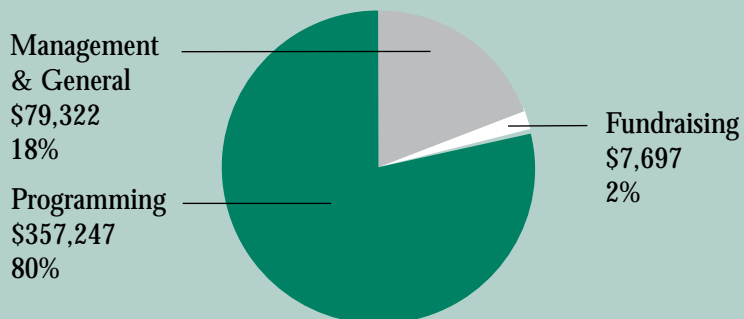
REVENUE
